### **FOODBANK CHAIRMAN AND CEO REPORT FOR 2015/16**

Many years of hoping, planning, wishing and a lot of very hard work, all came together with the new Distribution Centre being operational from 25th October 2015. The Official Opening was performed by His Excellency General The Honourable David Hurley AC DSC (Ret'd) Governor of NSW and Patron of Foodbank NSW & ACT Limited on December 16th 2015 in the presence of The Honourable Mark Speakman SC – Minister for the Environment & Heritage, Julie Owens MP, Member for Mulgoa deputising for Family & Community Services Minister, The Honourable Brad Hazzard and local Blacktown MP John Robertson.

Even though the new facility was only open for 8 months of the year it enabled increased volumes of product such as:

- Total distributed volume 6.54 million kg or 11.775 million meals provided to charities across NSW and the ACT. This is an increase of 13% from last year of 764.000 kg or 1.375.000 meals
- Fresh produce and groceries distribution represented a \$58.9 million saving (retail value) to the welfare agencies, community groups and Government Agencies. This contribution allows the groups to invest more on support services to address the root cause of hunger.
- The number of agencies assisted during the year was 498 including 90 new members.
- Waste Not Want Not in the Riverina has been operating for 5 years and this year in combination with donated supply from the Flemington Fruit & Vegetable Markets total tonnage was up 332,000 kg or 664,000 meals.
- Total staple foods available was up 15% (1,183,000kg) on last year which equates to 2.4 million meals.
- Purchased food continues to grow with \$1.174,000 spent this year up from \$678,000 last year and this was the result of increased demand for protein products.

The work of Foodbank Australia in securing Federal Government funds for Milk and the Key Staples program is greatly appreciated. Fixed Federal Government funding for the next 2 years of only \$750,000 per year will continue to put pressure on the supply of staple products and if this is not increased the need to raise funds at State level will need to dramatically increase.

A special thanks to Enzo Allara AO the recently retired Chair of Foodbank Australia for his dedication and support plus a big welcome to Tony Froggatt the new FBA Chair.

The agreement in place with NSW FACS for the transport to NSW country charities has one more year to run. This subsidy is supplemented by a charge to the charities to offset the transport cost shortfall.

Volunteer numbers are strong with enthusiastic support from Corporate Volunteer groups. Managing large number of volunteers needing constant attention and review has necessitated us to appoint a permanent Volunteer Coordinator.

Managing many people in the new Distribution Centre is much easier and we are now able to engage increased volunteer numbers.

With the greatly increased chiller and freezer capacity much higher rescue levels of produce are achieved and in line with the EPA milestone commitments we made in our grant applications. Milestone 1, 2 & 3 targets have been achieved and the final milestone 4 is due in December 2016.

The new DC is fully functional and all special design features are operating as planned.

#### WHAT A WONDERFUL YEAR **GREAT MODERN NEW HOME RECORD MEALS SUPPLIED - A** WHOPPING 11.775.000 MEALS

Warehouse "B" of 2,000 square metres has been leased out until August 2017 as this was not needed initially and this has provided welcome income for 5 months of this year and will do so for all of the new financial year.

An increased emphasis is being placed on PR, Marketing & Digital Media to raise funds along with lifting our overall profile to the public and corporate sponsors. A further push with Fundraising will take place in the new financial year.

KPMG continue to supply pro-bono Accounting and Auditing Services and this is greatly appreciated.

We sincerely thank His Excellency General the Honourable David Hurley AC DSC (Ret'd) Governor of New South Wales (Our Patron) for the ongoing Vice-Regal support.

In conclusion we wish to thank our Volunteers, Staff and Directors for their dedication and support as without their combined efforts Foodbank NSW &ACT could not possibly operate.



The challenge is to increase throughput by two and half times over the next five years. This will necessitate raising funds to purchase significantly more food than we currently do.

We must therefore establish reliable recurring funding to meet our objectives.






